

A Tribute to Rachel Fletcher, Founder of River Walk from the Board of the Great Barrington Land Conservancy

More than 180 people celebrated Rachel Fletcher, River Walk, and her 30 years of community activism at an event at Crissey Farms. The following remarks were made by GBLC's President, Janice Kabel:

"When we think about the history of environmental leadership in our country, it is the efforts of three women that stand out:

First, we remember Rachel Carson, who rallied the country around her to save our natural habitats and wildlife from pesticide pollution. She taught us that conservation begins with reclaiming what we have lost.

We also remember the author Marjory Stoneman Douglas, who used the power of her writings over decades to exhort Floridians to prevent development of the Everglades and to preserve it forever. She showed us that no environmental fight is too big to take on if the community is with you.

And now we also think of Rachel Fletcher standing with these women,

because she showed the same qualities of vision, leadership and fierce determination. She harnessed the vision of the community to clean up the eyesore behind Melvin's Pharmacy and create the hidden natural world that is the Housatonic River Walk. She enlisted hundreds of volunteers to rebuild the area and then insisted that we maintain the river's edge at the highest ecological standards. She wrote innumerable grant applications and fundraising letters, secured access to the land, hauled out the rubbish, planted native plants and helped rake the gravel so that Great Barrington could have its own National Recreational Trail and the W.E.B. Du Bois River Park. Rachel is our environmental heroine.

Rachel is an original member of the Board of the Great Barrington Land Conservancy from the time we organized in 1991. In many ways, our organization grew up around Rachel and her efforts to create the Housatonic River Walk. Rachel's leadership has informed all of our efforts, and thus, all our special places,

Let's Get our Kids Outside!

Adventures in our natural spaces are key to helping our kids connect to place, discover nature, and find enjoyment in the great outdoors. These shared adventures are essential to building a healthy community and securing the future of conservation. Here's one of story of how your land conservancy is building long lasting connections:

On Wednesday, June 13th, 2018, twelve boisterous thirteen-year-old boys clambered out of the school bus that had delivered them to the Pfeiffer Arboretum. Though none of the boys had ever been to this preserve before, many of them had collapsible fishing poles hidden in their backpacks. They were about to begin a 3-day service project (Youth Engagement Service Days) piloted this year at Monument Valley Middle School. They had specifically chosen this project because each day brought them to a new body of water. None of these energy-packed students had ever visited the Pfeiffer Arboretum before – they were in for a busy day of hard work and discovery. First, they from HVA, they teamed up in canoes to found and labeled 12 native tree species to scour the shoreline for trash, and they used create a tree walk that would be enjoyed by visitors for the rest of the season. Then, for number of fish caught and released. It they formed 3-person teams to carefully repaint all of the trails many blue blazes. Finally, at 2 pm, with just an hour left of their first service day, the boys were faced with the "Big Log Challenge". Not a problem! We'll be keeping you heard that their next 2 days would bring them to Housatonic Flats and then to Lake Mansfield, two great places where fishing is celebrated!

GBLC coordinated with Berkshire Natural Resources Council and Housatonic Valley Association (HVA) to provide this special service experience. On Day 2 the boys installed new signage and battled invasive species at Housatonic Flats. On Day 3 these same students planted over 100 native perennial species to create a new pollinator garden at Lake Mansfield

and, after receiving paddling safety training their break times to cast lines and compete was amazing to see what boundless energy can accomplish! Many of the boys talked about bringing their families to the worksites to see what they had done.
